Your task is to inform your groupmates about the book you have read at home in English for your own pleasure. Your account must include the information about **the author of the book, the storyline and the main characters**. You should also include **your reasons for choosing this book** as well as **state your opinion** in an elaborate manner **about the material** you had chosen to read. You should also **select 5 new words or expressions** that you came across while reading the book and **share them with your groupmates in an interesting manner**.

N.B. A very important part of your sharing is the Reflection. In your reflection you should analyse the ups and downs of dealing with accomplishing this task. Mention the pros and cons as well as how you could up your game the next time around the need be there.

Make sure your account is **organised** and has an introduction and a conclusion. You should cover all the required information within 4-5 minutes. Double check **grammar** and **pronunciation** of the vocabulary you are planning to use.
